
Dear Ms. White:

Following up CJA's April 18<sup>th</sup> letter to you, which I gave you, *in hand*, at the "Fair Trial-Free Press" annual meeting of the Columbia School of Journalism, enclosed are materials in further support of CJA's request for your intervention in the above-entitled appeal and for criminal investigation of the New York State Attorney General's subversion of the judicial process to "protect" a corrupt State Commission on Judicial Conduct.

These materials consist of my critique of the Attorney General's Respondent's Brief, demonstrating it to be a fraudulent deceit, from beginning to end, as well as my May 3<sup>rd</sup> letters transmitting the critique to Attorney General Spitzer and Deputy Solicitor General Belohlavek.

Needless to say, the foregoing is without prejudice to CJA's view that you should recuse yourself and promptly refer this matter to the Justice Department's Public Integrity Section of its Criminal Division, as set forth in CJA's April 18<sup>th</sup> letter to you and in the mountain of previous correspondence beginning with CJA's October 21, 1999 criminal complaint/intervention request.
