> venue provision of the "disruption of Congress" statute and the

> The status of the appeal is as follows. I was compelled to file my
> 50-page "conforming brief on the merits" on November 7th. The second
> and third issues are UNCHANGED from my original June 28th appellant's
> brief. They remain 1-1/4 and 10 pages, respectively.

> The U.S. Attorney has applied for an extension of time for filing its
> brief until January 27th -- which leaves ample time for you to file the
> Guild's amicus brief in early-mid January.
