Following up the e-mails I sent you on Monday, June 13th, about NY's *not-yet operational* and *publicly-inaccessible* Judicial Compensation Commission, Jennifer Golson of Thomson Reuters reported, on Thursday, June 16th, that "a coalition of more than 1,100 New York judges has asked the Commission for a 41-percent pay hike", which will cost taxpayers \$78 million, plus retroactive pay.
