

Joann Crupi has been editor/opinion pages since 1996. She previously was managing editor for features and executive city editor and a reporter and editor for the now-defunct Knickerbocker News. She also was a reporter for the former Syracuse Herald Journal. She is an Albany native and resident. A graduate of The College of Saint Rose, she received a master's degree in journalism from Syracuse University

John de Rosier joined the Times Union in 1999, after five ears as editorial cartoonist for the Mobile Register in Alabama. While a student at Brigham Young University, de Rosier won the Charles M. Schulz Award, presented to the nation's outstanding college cartoonist. His work has appeared in publications including "The Best Editorial Cartoons of the Year." He is a native of the Pacific Northwest, and lives with his family in Albany.

George R. Hearst III is the Times Union's publisher. He joined the paper in 1989 as operations director after working in various management positions for the San Francisco Newspaper Agency, then-publisher of the San Francisco Examiner and the San Francisco Chronicle. He became the Times Union's associate publisher and general manager in 2006, and was named publisher in 2009. A native of California and a graduate of Pepperdine University (Los Angeles), he is a great-grandson of the Hearst Corporation's founder, William Randolph Hearst.

Jay Jochnowitz was named editorial page editor in August 2008. He joined the Times Union in 1987 and covered Albany for 10 years before becoming state editor in 2000. He previously worked as a reporter for the Watertown Daily Times and the weekly Smithtown Messenger. He is a Long Island native and graduate of Skidmore College. He and his wife live in Knox. They have three children.

Jim McGrath has been the Times Union's chief editorial writer since 1996. He previously held several editing jobs at the paper, including copy desk chief. McGrath began his newspaper career as a reporter for The News-Sun in Waukegan, Ill., and was a news editor at The Knickerbocker News. He is a native of Boston. A graduate of Lake Forest College, he has a master's degree in journalism from Northwestern University. McGrath and his wife live in

Harry Rosenfeld has been editor-at-large of the Times Union since 1996 and writes a weekly column. Rosenfeld came to Albany in 1978 as editor of the Times Union and The Knickerbocker News, a post he held until 1994. He then spent three years focusing on the editorial pages and on projects for Hearst Newspapers. Rosenfeld previously worked for the New York Herald Tribune and for The Washington Post. Born in Berlin, Germany, he moved to The Bronx with his family just before the start of World War II. He is a Syracuse University graduate. He and his wife live in Albany.
