STATE OPERATIONS BUDGET

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. a) The several amounts specified in this chapter for state 2 operations, or so much thereof as shall be sufficient to accomplish the 3 purposes designated by the appropriations, are hereby appropriated and authorized to be paid as hereinafter provided, to the respective public officers and for the several purposes specified.

b) Where applicable, appropriations made by this chapter for expenditures from federal grants for state operations may be allocated for spending from federal grants for any grant period beginning, during, or

prior to, the state fiscal year beginning on April 1, 2019.

c) The several amounts named herein, or so much thereof as shall be 11 sufficient to accomplish the purpose designated, being the undisbursed 12 and/or unexpended balances of the prior year's appropriations, are here-13 by reappropriated from the same funds and made available for the same 14 purposes as the prior year's appropriations, unless herein amended, for the fiscal year beginning April 1, 2019. Certain reappropriations in 16 this chapter are shown using abbreviated text, with three leader dots (an ellipsis) followed by three spaces (...) used to indicate where 18 existing law that is being continued is not shown. However, unless a 19 change is clearly indicated by the use of brackets [] for deletions and 20 underscores for additions, the purposes, amounts, funding source and all 21 other aspects pertinent to each item of appropriation shall be as last 22 appropriated.

For the purpose of complying with the state finance law, the year, 24 chapter and section of the last act reappropriating a former original appropriation or any part thereof is, unless otherwise indicated, chap-

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d) No moneys appropriated by this chapter shall be available for 28 payment until a certificate of approval has been issued by the director 29 of the budget, who shall file such certificate with the department of 30 audit and control, the chairperson of the senate finance committee and 31 the chairperson of the assembly ways and means committee.

e) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, because the funds for 33 certain appropriations specified in this chapter are to be used by the 34 state education department, department of health, office of children and 35 family services, office of temporary and disability assistance, office 36 of alcoholism and substance abuse services, office of mental health,

office for people with developmental disabilities, department of environmental conservation, and the office of parks, recreation and historic preservation for the administration, oversight or alternative delivery of those programs within those agencies' budgets set forth in the aid to localities budget bill submitted by the governor on January 15, 2019 pursuant to article VII of the New York constitution, no funds under those specified appropriations in this chapter shall be available for certification or payment until (i) the legislature has finally acted upon the appropriations for the aforementioned agencies contained in the aforementioned aid to localities budget bill, and (ii) the director of the budget has determined that those aid to localities appropriations as finally acted on by the legislature are sufficient for the ensuing fiscal year.

f) The appropriations contained in this chapter shall be available for

the fiscal year beginning on April 1, 2019.
