I have received your April 16, 2021 acknowledgment of CJA's February 7, 2021 conflict-ofinterest/misconduct complaint pertaining to the commission-based judicial salary increases and judiciary budget, challenged by the *CJA v. Cuomo...Schneiderman...DiFiore citizen-taxpayer action* – and have posted it on CJA's website, here: <u>http://www.judgewatch.org/web-pages/searching-nys/cjc/feb-7-</u> <u>21-cjc-complaint-menu-page.htm</u>.

Am I correct in assuming that your assignment of numbers "2021-A-0083-0085" means that you have divided the complaint into three: A-0083 is for the complaint against the associate justices of the New York Court of Appeals; A-0084 is for the complaint against the justices of the Appellate Division, Third Department; and A-0085 is for the complaint against Chief Judge DiFiore and Chief Administrative Judge Marks?

As against the justices of the Appellate Division, Third Department, I herewith initiate a further and supplementing complaint addressed to their demonstrated actual bias, born of their undisclosed conflict-of-interest in the *Delgado v. New York State* citizen taxpayer action, challenging the committee-based legislative and executive salary increases. The particulars are set forth in the above-attached "legal autopsy"/analysis of the Appellate Division, Third Department's March 18, 2021 "Opinion and Order" in *Delgado*, purporting to be written by Associate Justice Michael Lynch, with the concurrence of his four fellow panel justices on the appeal: Appellate Division, Third Department Presiding Justice Elizabeth Garry and Associate Justices Stan Pritzker, Sharon Aarons, and Molly Reynolds Fitzgerald. Department Attorney Grievance Committee, Monica Duffy – most importantly pertaining to Senior Assistant Solicitor General Victor Paladino and Assistant Attorney General Helena Lynch, which I have above-attached.
