More Information on Judges

Federal judges agreed to give the public more information about cases in which judges are disciplined by their colleagues. Final orders on complaints will be posted on appeals court Web sites, and, in most cases, judges will be named if they have been sanctioned. But only a handful of cases advance beyond a preliminary review. The changes were adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States, a 27-judge body led by Chief Justice John G. Roberts Jr.
