I would, however, be most appreciative if you would e-mail me an estimate as to when I might expect your call -- and whether, as yet, you have had occasion to read the documents at the top of the homepage of the website of our non-partisan, non-profit citizens' organization, www.judgewatch.org, to which I specifically referred you in my messages, to wit, my aborted April 14th "opening statement" -- described by Mr. Cauvin's April 15th article as "rambling" -- and my June 16, 2003 memo to Ralph Nader, Public Citizen, and Common Cause -- three copies of which I gave Mr. Cauvin, including two, directly in hand -- and whose serious content as to the transcending significance of the "disruption of Congress" case he not only omitted from his reporting, but -- as it relates to the Senate Judiciary Committee -- outrightly concealed.
