Dear Professor –

As requested, I confirm that the posted exhibit is “unrelated to Alex Daoud”. As I immediately recognized from the web address for the exhibit that you sent me, it is posted on a webpage I created in 2007 or 2008 for Mary Alice Gwynn, which – as I showed you -- is accessible from CJA’s homepage, www.judgewatch.org, via the left sidebar panel “Our Members’ Efforts”. The webpage for Mary Alice Gwynn, Esq. -- <http://www.judgewatch.org/web-pages/cja-members-efforts/Gwynn.htm> -- reveals that the exhibit is part of a September 28, 2007 federal judicial misconduct complaint she had filed against U.S. Bankruptcy Judge Paul Hyman in the Eleventh Circuit.

A short time ago, I called the phone number indicated on the complaint to find out from Attorney Gwynn what the disposition of her complaint was, as the webpage only posts the Eleventh Circuit’s October 9, 2007 acknowledgment. I got a recorded message – and left a voice mail message requesting her call back.

By the way, I am not only searching for scholarship for CJA’s groundbreaking public interest lawsuits against [The New York Times](#) and [Gannett](#) for “journalistic fraud” and “institutional reckless disregard for truth” – causes of action whose viability under the First Amendment is – as I told you -- **established** by the FULLY-POSTED RECORD of each lawsuit showing that [The New York Times](#) and [Gannett](#) had NO defense to recognition of these causes of action and were each protected by the courts, on both trial and appellate levels. I am also searching for scholarship on CJA’s 2008 groundbreaking Critique of the 2006 Breyer Committee Report on federal judicial discipline. Indeed, it is for this reason that the Critique remains featured on our “Latest News” webpage, accessible from the top panel of our website, as follows:
