I received your letter of March 30<sup>th</sup>. Our procedures have been explained to you many times. Therefore, I see no need to repeat them at this time. You are free, of course to hold your own opinion with regard to our rules. Nevertheless, there is no language conferring the right to an extension of time in Rule 7(c); so I will not address this matter further.

With regard to your letter of March 17, 1998, I presume that you are asking for responses to your many inquiries regarding the flow of the mail here at the Second Circuit. I can only repeat — again, as I have in the past — that yours is not the only case with which we deal. Therefore, there will be many times when material will arrive at the courthouse many days prior to its being handled. As is the case in many large businesses, the arrival of a piece of mail at the Second Circuit does not necessarily mean that it arrives at a particular office on that date.
