I would also like to give prominence to the following quote from the 1996 edition of your Judicial Disqualification book. Do you repeat this statement in your 2003 edition?

“...the theoretical underpinnings of American judicial disqualification jurisprudence remain murky and unsettled. In fact, the modern American case precedents that deal with judicial disqualification issues are replete with inconsistencies, which suggest the absence of a sound theoretical base...” § 1.6

I would, of course, be pleased to send you the cert petition in my important "disruption of Congress" case -- whose overarching issues are those of judicial disqualification for interest and pervasive actual bias meeting the "impossibility of fair judgment" standard of *Liteky v.
