Where can I find political journalists to investigate and report on important electoral races in Syracuse University's *own* backyard: (1) for Onondaga County district attorney, involving incumbent D.A. William Fitzpatrick; and (2) for Supreme Court justices for the Fifth Judicial District, which includes Onondaga County, involving former Onondaga County comptroller-turned state senator Robert Antonacci. To date, there has been virtually NO reporting that would enable voters to make informed electoral decisions. How about your political journalism students? Are they available?
