Dear Ms. Goldsmith,

I hereby petition the judicial council for review of the Order of Acting Chief Judge THOMAS J. MESKILL ["Meskill"] dated October 23, 1990 in the above matter.

1a. I am a born American with a good command of the American language.

b. With crystal clarity my complaint of October 10, 1990, sets forth the facts and basis thereof.

c. Under no conceivable construction could my complaint possibly be attenuated into the frail statement:

"Complainant's view that the [Chief] judge has an administrative duty to supervise compliance with a district judge's order ...".

d. Without a single exception, aside from Judge Meskill, every person who has read my complaint has concluded that "impeachment" was warranted and indeed mandated.

2a. Following a wise suggestion, I waited almost the full period of 30 days, before filing this protest.

b. Apparently nothing was done either by the Chief Judge or Judge Meskill, during such further one month period, to recover such monies, diverted from the federal government to private pockets.

c. I strongly suggest that a letter to the U.S. Attorney would have proved fruitful in making recovery.



d. The facts inexorably and irresistibly command "impeachment", since the neglect of the Chief Judge to refer the matter to the U.S. Attorney, or take any other action since October 10, without more, amounts to ratification of such diversion and larceny of government funds.

3. The Chief Judge and Judge Meskill should read the Code of Judicial Conduct, particularly Canon 3B, rather than label beforehand all criticism as "frivolous".

4. Under the facts herein, no matter what attempts may be made to debilitate them in any restatement, I have no doubt that I will have the support of the American taxpaying public when they insist upon removal from office.
