Dear Ms. Kiklier,

Thank you for the acknowledgment of my complaint against the above, dated March 3, 1994.

I wish to prevail upon the Commission to bifurcate my complaint, giving the matter with respect to Sam Polur, Esq. prompt and immediate attention, while holding the balance of my complaint in abeyance until my supplemental information is received, which should be shortly.

1a. Albeit not in your power, my immediate goal is to stay and/or revoke Mr. Polur's suspension based upon the misconduct of the above, the Departmental Disciplinary Committee, and others, however indirect the means employed.

b. There can be no legal excuse for the failure of DDC to have me testify since, as it knew, I, not Polur, was possessed of the vindicating information, including the perjury of Donald F. Schneider, Esq., on the subject.

c. To repeat, at no time, at no place, has Schneider or anyone else on the scene on April 10, 1985, ever controverted my statements that Polur did not serve any summons on Schneider, nor was there any rational reason for any request by me that Polur should serve any summons upon Schneider.

2a. There was, however, a reason to have Polur incarcerated, to wit., to deny Hyman Raffé of the protection of legitimate counsel so that he could be made the object of "rack and screw" procedures, compelling his submission.

b. Having incarcerated Polur, and attained the desired goal, to thereafter suspend him from the practice of law, is depraved and demented, and should be made the subject of immediate punishment.

3a. Significantly, I have not received from Schneider any sworn affidavit or affirmation, made under penalty of perjury, that the alleged "corpus delicti", was the summons served upon him.

b. Without a "corpus delicti", except in circumstances not here relevant, even a confession will not support a conviction.
