Dear Mr. Stern,

1. As you can see from the enclosed Judiciary Law §35-a Summary Statement issued by the Office of Court Administration, received today, that although Lee Feltman, Esq. knew from a prior appointment that there was to be a filing of any compensated judicial appointment, none were filed in the Puccini Clothes, Ltd. receivership.

2a. Judge DAVID S. SAXE ["Saxe"] and Referee DONALD DIAMOND ["Diamond"], who made awards to the judicial "thieves" and "indulgence peddlers", without making any of the mandatory filings, each found me in non-summary criminal contempt, without benefit of any due process rights, which manifestly unconstitutional convictions were accepted as conclusive by Mr. Justice WILLIAM C. THOMPSON ["Thompson"] in my disbarment proceedings in an attempt to advance and conceal this criminal racketeering adventure, in which Judge Thompson was an essential participant.

b. Neither Judge Saxe nor Referee Diamond could lawfully justify \$1.00 of the more than \$700,000 awards made by them, and therefore did not file, as Judge Thompson actually knew.

3. The evidence is clear, although I forwarded to you only a part thereof, that Judge Thompson must be removed from the bench, criminally prosecuted, and certainly removed, forthwith, from your Commission.
