Honorable Sir:

1a. For me, at least, the judicial proceedings at Nuremburg, after the close of World War II, resolved the issue of the "crime of obedience" and the "crime of silence".

b. In any event, I have no intention of remaining silent with respect to conduct set forth in page 4 of my letter to Your Honor, Presiding Justice A. Franklin Mahoney, and Presiding Justice Michael F. Dillon, dated Feb. 16, 1987.


c. My aforementioned letter, the first of a series, entitled "In the name of God, go", seeks as its ultimate aim a public airing of my charges against and/or impeachment of Presiding Justice Francis T. Murphy.

2a. I wish to make it eminently clear, that no person nor judge has the legitimate power to interfere with the judicial decision-making obligation of another jurist, except as authorized by law.

b. Nor does any jurist have the right to abdicate his absolute obligation to make such judicial decision solely according to his own conscience.

c. I, for one, will no more hear that there exists "instructions from higher authority" from jurists in Your Honor's department, or any other judicial department.
