RE: Nomination of Andrew O'Rourke

Dear President Bush:

We have received <u>no</u> response to our January 7, 1992 letter--which followed up our November 20, 1991 letter--requesting information as to the basis for your nomination of Andrew O'Rourke for a federal judgeship.

We are informed by the Senate Judiciary Committee that such information must be sought from you <u>directly</u>. Indeed, we received a letter from Chairman Biden, dated January 31, 1992, stating:

> "...your inquiries about the selection of Mr. O'Rourke for this position--a process in which the Judiciary Committee is <u>not</u> involved--should be directed to Senator D'Amato's office and the White House."

To date, despite our numerous requests to Senator D'Amato's office, we have received <u>no</u> response as to the basis for the Senator's recommendation of Mr. O'Rourke's name to you.

In view of the lapse of <u>three months</u> since our initial November 20, 1991 letter--and the fact that this nominee is presently before the Senate Judiciary Committee for confirmation--we respectfully ask that this request be accorded some priority.
