Wash. Times Joins Witch Hunt Against Judicial Nominee Halligan

In a February 9 editorial, titled, "Detain this judicial nominee," *The Washington Times* attacked Obama judicial nominee Caitlin Halligan, claiming that there are "disturbing discrepancies" in her Senate testimony and that a "Republican senator should put an indefinite hold on the nomination" if Democrats don't allow a "full investigation." *Media Matters* has noted that National Review Online contributor Ed Whelan recently targeted Halligan.

Review of the e-mail trail should show what role Ms. Halligan played and "whether she agreed with the positions that she now distances herself from," Mr. Whelan wrote for NRO.
