Dear Chief Judge Kaye:

Following up CJA's October 17th hand-delivery to your Chambers of a copy of CJA's October 16, 2000 Report, enclosed is a superseding copy of that Report. This superseding copy reflects changes set forth in CJA's October 18, 2000 memorandum to bar association recipients, faxed to them, as well as the New York State Commission on Judicial Nomination and the New York State Commission on Judicial Conduct on that date. For your convenience, a copy of that faxed memorandum is annexed as Exhibit "A".

Additionally enclosed are the substantiating evidentiary materials to CJA's October 16, 2000 Report *not* already in your possession. You already possess virtually all the substantiating evidentiary materials listed on the inventory to File Folder "A", annexed to the October 16, 2000 Report.

The substantiating materials for File Folder "A" to CJA's October 16, 2000 Report not already in your possession and herewith transmitted are Items #1, #2, and #3 from "CJA's additional correspondence with Commission on Judicial Conduct" consisting of CJA's May 17, 2000 letter to the Commission; CJA's June 26, 2000

Page numbers on the superseding October 16, 2000 Report are also changed so that the prefatory text preceding the Table of Contents begins on page 1, rather than page 2. This text is now entitled "Introduction".

As for File Folder "B", you already possess all the substantiating evidentiary materials listed on the inventory annexed to CJA's October 16, 2000 Report. CJA's three 1994 facially-meritorious judicial misconduct complaints and the Commission's dismissal and acknowledgment letters are all annexed to the copy of the verified petition in *Doris L. Sassower v. Commission* (NY Co. #95-109141)², which, together with that Article 78 file, was hand-delivered to your Chambers under CJA's March 3, 2000 letter to you. The remaining inventoried materials are part of the file of the Article 78 proceeding *Elena Ruth Sassower v. Commission* (NY Co. #99-108551), a copy of which was also hand-delivered to your Chambers under CJA's March 3, 2000 letter to you. This includes all the materials listed under the inventory heading "Exchange of Correspondence".

The copies of these two Article 78 files, as likewise of the Article 78 proceeding *Mantell v. Commission* (NY Co. #99-108655) are, upon information and belief, in the possession of your Special Inspector General for Fiduciary Appointments.

CJA's September 19, 1994 complaint is Exhibit "G" thereto; CJA's October 26, 1994 complaint is Exhibit "I", and CJA's December 5, 1994 complaint is Exhibit "J". The attachments to these complaints – which were not annexed to the verified petition in the Article 78 proceeding, but which were provided to the bar association recipients with free-standing copies of these three complaints, are available upon request. As for the Commission's September 28, 1994, November 4, 1994, and December 14, 1994 acknowledgment letters, these are Exhibits "K-5", "K-7", and "K-8" to the verified petition. The Commission's December 13, 1994 and January 24, 1995 dismissal letters are Exhibits "L-5" and "L-6" thereto.

CJA's October 6, 1998 complaint is Exhibit "C-1" to the verified petition. The Commission's November 3, 1998 acknowledgment letter is Exhibit "D-2" and its December 23, 1998 dismissal letter is Exhibit "F-3".

As for CJA's "Exchange of Correspondence, etc.", most of the inventoried documents are annexed to Exhibit "G" to the verified petition. Thus, #1, CJA's May 6, 1997 fax coversheet to the Commission is Exhibit "E-1" thereto; #3, CJA's May 13, 1997 faxed letter to Chairman Berger is Exhibit "E-2" thereto; #5, CJA's April 17, 1996 letter to Gerald Stern, Administrator, Commission on Judicial Conduct is Exhibit "D-11" thereto; and #6, Mr. Stern's April 18, 1996 letter to CJA is Exhibit "D-12".

As for #2, CJA's May 5, 1996 memorandum to, *inter alia*, the Commission with annexed 3-page analysis, it is Exhibit "A" to the verified petition. As for #3, CJA's \$3,000 public interest ad, "Restraining 'Liars in the Courtroom' and on the Public Payroll" (NYLJ, 8/27/97, pp. 3-4), it is Exhibit "B" to the verified petition.

As for #7, it is CJA's July 28, 1999 Notice of Motion in the Article 78 proceeding. #8 is Exhibit "L" to my July 28, 1999 moving affidavit therein.

As she has failed to undertake *any* discernible follow-up to a July 11, 2000 interview I had with Bill Flanagan, an "auditor" working with her, these files should be retrieved by you so that you may finally discharge your mandatory duty to the People of this State to protect them from the systemic governmental corruption reflected by CJA's October 16, 2000 Report, involving the corruption of the New York State Commission on Judicial Conduct and New York State Commission on Judicial Nomination – state agencies responsible for safeguarding judicial integrity, to which you appoint members.
