Elena,

At the Empire Center, we work hard to develop the public policy research and data New Yorkers need to keep government in its rightful place—fully accountable to taxpayers.

Sometimes, however, information alone isn't enough. When state and local agencies violate the law and exceed the limits of their power, the fight for accountability must move into court.

That's where the new Government Justice Center comes in.

The Government Justice Center was established this year as an independent, non-profit, non-partisan organization focused on bringing legal challenges to government overreach. Led by its executive director and general counsel, Cameron J. "Cam" Macdonald, the Center's mission is to protect New York taxpayers from government waste, negligence, misappropriation and other improper actions.

In May, the Government Justice Center filed its first lawsuit, challenging the practice in which some government employees in New York are paid for work on labor union business. The case—focused on taxpayer-funded "release time" for the president of the Syracuse teachers' union—is now heading to appeal from the State Supreme Court.


Today, the Center filed a suit against one of New York's largest county governments, Suffolk County on Long Island, seeking to overturn their recent illegal imposition of new or added fees to raise general revenue. This case also has potentially broader implications

for other counties and local governments across our state.
