This is to acknowledge receipt of your request dated March 21, 2025 pursuant to the Freedom of Information Law.

You are requesting..."The Senate and Assembly webpages for the ten bills comprising the FY2025-26 budget purport that on Monday, March 10, 2025, the Senate and Assembly each amended eight budget bills. These are the same eight as Governor Hochul had amended, on February 21, 2025, by her 30-day amendments, posted on her Division of the Budget webpage of FY 2026 Executive Budget Legislation. By these March 10, 2025 amendments,

- State Operations Appropriation Bill S.3000-A/A.3000-A became <u>S.3000-B</u> and <u>A.3000-B</u>;
- Aid to Localities Appropriation Bill S.3003-A/A.3003-A became <u>S.3003-B</u> and <u>A.3003-B</u>;
- Capital Projects Appropriation Bill S.3004-A/A.3004-A became <u>S.3004-B</u> and <u>A.3004-B</u>;
- Public Protection & General Government Budget Bill S.3005-A/A.3005-A became S.3005-B and A.3005-B;
- Education, Labor, Housing & Family Assistant Budget Bill S.3006-A/A.3006-A became S.3006-B and A.3006-B;
- Health & Mental Hygiene Budget Bill S.3007-A/A.3007-A became <u>S.3007-B</u> and A.3007-B;
- Transportation, Economic Development, & Environmental Conservation Budget Bill S.3008-A/A.3008-A became S.3008-B and A.3008-B;
- Revenue Budget Bill S.3009-A/S.3009-A became <u>S.3009-B</u> and <u>A.3009-B</u>.

There are NO votes on the amendments and NO memoranda in support of the amendments posted on the Senate and Assembly webpages. The Senate's website reflects NO Senate Finance Committee meeting on March 10, 2025 and I believe there was also NO meeting of the Assembly Ways and Means Committee. No budget bills were on the calendar or brought to the Senate and Assembly floor on that date. The VIDEOS are here and here and here.

How then and where were these eight budget bills "amended"?

Pursuant to <u>Public Officers Law Article VI</u> ("FOIL"), <u>Senate Rule XIV</u> ("Freedom of Information"), and <u>Assembly Rule VIII</u> ("Public Access to Records"), this is to request records showing: (1) the sponsors of the amendments to these eight budget bills; (2) all changes the

amendments made to the eight budget bills; (3) memoranda in support of the amendments, including fiscal impact statements; (3) discussion/debate on the amendments; (4) the votes taken on the amendments".

Please note the function of this office is to respond to requests for records maintained by the Senate, not to answer questions. The New York State Senate website (https://www.nysenate.gov/legislation) allows members of the public to browse the current laws of New York.
