As discussed, I enclose a copy of my mother's cert petition to the U.S. Supreme Court, seeking review of her Article 78 proceeding, Sassower v. Mangano, et al. Pages 3-7 provide an overview of the Appellate Division, Second Department's politically-motivated, retaliatory, and criminal conduct, which was the subject of the proceeding.

I also draw your attention to pages 8-10, which summarize the Article 78 submissions that were before the Appellate Division, Second Department when it rendered its indefensible and fraudulent September 20, 1993 order dismissing the Article 78 proceeding (see pages 10-11). As you can see from our March 22, 1995 complaint to the Ethics Commission, such submissions were transmitted to the Commission on Judicial Conduct when we filed the September 19, 1994 complaint with it (#5).

Again, much as our September 19, 1994 complaint proffered the files in the underlying disciplinary proceeding to the Commission on Judicial Conduct (at pages 6-7), so we are ready, willing, and able to provide the Ethics Commission with a copy of those files upon request. As set forth therein:

"The files under A.D. #90-00315 leave no doubt but that the justices of the Appellate Division, Second Department have employed their judicial offices to advance ulterior retaliatory goals, there being not the slightest factual or legal basis for any of the Orders issued thereunder."
