MESSAGE #1 (sent at about 4:00 a.m., September 24, 2020) -- This is a TIP/LEAD for election coverage. Manhattan's 18 state legislators, ALL running for re-election, are ALL the subject of a public corruption/grand jury complaint, filed with Manhattan D.A. Vance, establishing that the pay raise they procured for themselves -- boosting their salaries from \$79,500 to \$110,000 -- is fraudulent and larcenous -- and that they have not been doing their jobs to such a degree that the Legislature does NOT function at a constitutional level.

MESSAGE #2 (sent at 4:41 a.m., September 24, 2020) -- Following up the message, sent a short time ago, for election coverage of the 18 Manhattan state legislators, ALL running for re-election, the state legislators of NYC's other 4 boroughs are also up for re-election, and most are running for re-election or higher office. Materially-identical public corruption/grand jury complaints have ALSO been filed against them with NYC's 4 other D.A.s -- Bronx D.A. Clark, Brooklyn D.A. Gonzalez, Queens D.A. Katz, and Staten Island D.A.
