

GUIDE FOR MADISON COUNTY “LOCAL JOURNALISM”

INFORMING THE VOTERS:

Madison County's Uncontested Re-Election-Seeking D.A. Gabor & its 6 Re-Election-Seeking State Legislators, 2 Uncontested, Etc.

The duty of the Madison County D.A. is to enforce New York’s penal laws and obey conflict of interest protocols. That is the subject of the [Center for Judicial Accountability’s July 18, 2024 grand jury/public corruption complaint](#) to [Madison County D.A. William Gabor](#), sent to him by the below e-mail. It involves his \$221,100 D.A. salary, statutorily-linked to the Madison county court judge salary. Of this, \$101,300 is the product of three “false instrument”, penal law-violating commission reports that Madison County’s six state legislators, all running for re-election, are knowledgeable of and complicit in.

D.A. Gabor, who is running for re-election, uncontested, has not responded to the July 18, 2024 grand jury/public corruption complaint, which requested his response by August 1st to two simple questions:

- (1) whether he would repudiate the \$101,300 salary difference and advise Madison County to secure a judicial declaration voiding the three “false instrument”, penal law-violating commission reports?;
- (2) whether he would recuse himself from the July 18, 2024 grand jury/public corruption complaint and secure an independent prosecutor?

Surely, D.A. Gabor will be more responsive to inquiries from you – and he is ready to field them as I have sent him e-mails alerting him to press inquiries.

What does he have to say about the \$221,100 Madison County D.A. salary – and about Madison County’s state legislators whose public corruption is prioritized by the July 18, 2024 grand jury/public corruption complaint (at pp. 2-4). Will he disclose his political, professional, and personal relationships with them – and with the other public officers complained-against and implicated by the grand jury/public corruption complaint?

And can D.A. Gabor explain how it is possible that notwithstanding [Madison County has a population of 68,020 and median household income of \\$68,869](#) and [state legislator salaries are the highest in the nation, \\$142,000](#), on top of which, as with D.A. salaries, are many thousands of dollars more in non-salary compensation benefits:

- [Assemblyman Brian Maher \(AD101\)](#) is uncontested for re-election and is running on both Republican and Conservative lines for which he faced no primaries for either line;
- [Assemblyman Jeff Gallahan \(AD131\)](#) is uncontested for re-election and is running on both Republican and Conservative lines for which he faced no primaries for either line;
- [Senator Joe Griffo \(SD53\)](#) is running for re-election on both Republican and Conservative lines for which he faced no primaries for either line, against [James Meyers](#), running on both Democratic and Working Families lines for which he faced no primaries for either line;

- [Assemblyman Joe Angelino \(AD121\)](#) is running for re-election on both Republican and Conservative lines for which he faced no primaries for either line, against [Vicki Davis](#), running on a Democratic line for which she faced no primaries for that line;
- [Assemblyman Brian Miller \(AD122\)](#) is running for re-election on both Republican and Conservative lines for which he faced no primaries for either line, against [Adrienne Martini](#), running on both Democratic and Working Families lines for which she faced no primaries for either line;
- [Assemblyman Al Stirpe \(AD127\)](#) is running for re-election on both Democratic and Working Families lines for which he faced no primaries for either line, against [Timothy Kelly](#), running on both Republican and Conservative lines for which he faced no primaries for either line.

Indeed, can D.A. Gabor explain how it is possible that he himself is uncontested for re-election on both Republican and Conservative lines for which he faced no primaries for either line.

I look forward to discussing with you the above questions and assisting your investigative journalism about Madison County's D.A. race, six state legislative races, and judicial races from supreme court to city court – all involving “false instrument”, penal law-violating salaries for these offices.
