Dear Mr. Stern,

1. I received today your letter of the 26th inst., and appreciate your immediate attention to my request of the 24th inst., to which it was addressed.

2. I assume that your records are computerized and that you are sufficiently familiar with the basic capabilities of all computers.

I suggest that in a matter of a few minutes, at most, by a global search, or similar operation, your secretary can give you a list of all my complaints, the dates of same, and dates of their disposition, none of which are confidential insofar as they are disclosed to me.

3. In 1989, under a manifestly unconstitutional and illegal general search and seizure warrant, many years of my "data discs" were taken, as well as some of my hard documentation.

Years spent in attempting to reconstruct all my records have not been completely successful.

Obviously, since the prime object in such seizure was to obstruct my "whistle-blowing" activities, including as against the judiciary, I have not received much judicial assistance in obtaining the return of my papers, documents, and data discs.

The limited information that I have requested from your Commission is, I submit, under the circumstances, reasonable, non-burdensome, not intrusive, and certainly does not transgress any legal prohibitions.

4. In view of the aforementioned, I request you reconsider your response, which may result in a benefit to your Commission, since it will prevent the filing of a complaint, heretofore considered and disposed.
